Philip Janssens (b.1980, Lille) works express a delicate balance between objects and ideas. He combines variations of Process Art, Minimalism and Situationist theories interweaving metaphor with representations of indulgence.

During his Summer Studio Residency at The Moonens Foundations, Janssens has created works related to sculptural notions and fragments. They are concerned primarily with production, form, and strategy through the exploration of visual concepts that re-sequence the perceptions of his earlier works.

Through this method, Janssens merges the ideas of conceptualism and the politics of art. The political (of art) context adheres to a manner that each work is just essentially one work that expands/extends into another - yet is viewed as an individual piece. This is accomplished through a faceted construction which at times is dense and at others loose but always revealing of the formal qualities in his chose of materials while also employing underlying social statements.
